- 1 WA3 will be held from **11 August (Thurs) to 17 August (Wed)**. The following are attached:

- 2 Students will report to the school for flag-raising as usual. Lessons will resume as usual after their WA3.
- 3 The WA3 is a milestone check on students' learning for teachers to:
 - provide the necessary guidance and support to close any learning gaps, as well as,
 - engage parents on their child's/ward's academic progress before the End-of-Year Examination.
- 4 A Progress Report capturing the performance of your child/ward would be issued to him/her on 1 September, in the last week of Term 3. The report would allow you to have a good sensing of your child's/ward's academic progress and readiness for the End-of-Year Examination.
- 5 It is compulsory that students sit for all scheduled papers. However, if your child/ward is unwell or is tested positive for COVID-19, he/she should not report to school. He/she should see a doctor and submit an original and valid medical certificate* upon his/her return to school. Students who miss any paper and do not have a valid medical certificate will be awarded a zero mark for the paper they missed.

Rules and Regulations for School Examinations/ Weighted Assessment**Attire & Appearance**

1. All students must be in proper school attire with proper appearance as specified in the school rules and regulations.

Punctuality

2. Students who are late for any paper will report to the General Office before reporting to the respective venue.
3. No extra time will be given for late-comers.

Dishonesty

4. The school takes a serious view of any dishonesty, including the following:
 - i. has in his/ her possession any unauthorised devices capable of capturing, storing, displaying and/ or transmitting or receiving visual, audio or verbal information within the examination premises;
 - ii. has in his/ her possession any unauthorised reference material or notes;
 - iii. communicates or attempts to communicate with any other candidate/ unauthorised person during the examination or any other occasion when communication is prohibited;
 - iv. obtains or attempts to obtain or offers assistance on the examination material (e.g. copying) during the examinations;
 - v. commits or attempts any acts of dishonesty, or support such acts.
5. A student who commits or attempts any acts of dishonesty, or abetment of such acts would be awarded a zero mark for the paper.

Borrowing of Stationery

6. Students should bring their own stationery that they will need for the assessment papers. However, should they need assistance during the examination, they need to alert the invigilator.

Use of Washroom during Assessment

7. Students are encouraged to use the washroom before the start of the paper. They are not allowed to use the bathroom fifteen minutes after the start and before the end of the paper. Students are also discouraged to use the washroom in the midst of the examination so that they could fully utilise the time allocated for the paper.

Absence from Assessment

8. Attendance for all assessment is compulsory.
9. It is compulsory for students to sit for all components of subjects such as Oral, Listening Comprehension, Coursework, Practical and Written papers. Students will receive a zero mark for subjects if they do not turn up for one or more components and do not have a valid medical certificate to support their absence.
10. Students who are absent for any paper are required to submit an original and valid **Medical Certificate** to their Form Teacher supporting their absence immediately upon their return to school, failing which, a zero mark will be awarded for the paper the student is absent from without any valid reason.
11. Students who are confirmed COVID-19 cases (currently quarantined in hospital or community isolation facilities) or who are on medical leave or are unwell with fever or flu-like symptoms **should not come to school to sit** for any school-based assessment. Students are to inform their Form Teachers or any such circumstances and Form Teachers will advise the students accordingly.

At the start of and during the Assessment

12. Students are to carefully check that the paper for the correct subject and code has been distributed to them and that the number of printed pages is correct as stated in the question paper. Students taking SBB are to check that they have received the papers of the correct stream. Students need to alert the invigilator immediately should they think that there are errors in the papers distributed to them or if they have received the wrong question paper.
